

GBR IRC Committee – Rating Office Report 2019

12th September 2019

INTRODUCTION

IRC continues to have good numbers in the UK, representing around 25% of the worldwide fleet. We continue to see good support for the strong racing areas in the UK. The UK based IRC Classes such as the HP30, Performance 40 and Fast 40+ have a good programme of races. Attendance at events has been good with particular good entries in the offshore racing. The IRC Nationals in Cowes had encouraging entries this year with 44 entries in the IRC Class 1,2,3 & 4. 29 entries across the Fast 40+ (6), HP30 (7) and Performance 40 (16). As in 2015 and 2017, the Rolex Fastnet Race entry was full within 5 minutes of opening. Two handed racing continues to flourish with 64 entries in the Rolex Fastnet Race and the IRC Two-Handed National Championship scheduled for the 14 & 15 September 2019.

GBR IRC Statistics

To avoid confusion all numbers listed are to the end of August each year. In general we see this value increase by approximately 40 boats between that date and the end of the year.

In 2019 we have seen numbers stabilise with a small decrease of 8 boats (0.6%) in the number of boats holding full IRC certificates at the end of August. Details are shown in the table below.

The total number of shorthanded certificates issued this year was 18, 16 of these are in the Central South Coast region where there is strong support for single- and double-handed racing. Also a total of 38 boats had SERs issued, the same level as 2018 (37). This brings the total number of boats racing IRC up to 1395 for the year to the end of August.

The following table shows the total number of boats with full IRC certificates, including those issued under the Advocate Scheme, to 31 Dec 2015, 2016, 2017 & 2018. 2019 figures are to the end of August and also show number of Short-Handed certificates in each area, and Single Event Ratings.

IRC Advocate Scheme

In 2019 the Start Up and the Club Loyalty Scheme were discontinued in favour of the IRC Advocate Scheme. The aim of the scheme and terms and conditions are provided as a separate supporting paper to this report.

The Advocate scheme continues to deliver good results and at 31 August 2019 represents 11% of the total GBR boats rated. The success of the Advocate Scheme is primarily down to the excellent relationships we have with the Clubs and the passion they share for IRC. We never underestimate the efforts the individuals in the clubs put in and appreciate their drive and commitment.

The total number of boats issued certificates under this scheme rose from 154 in 2017 to 197 in 2018, and stands at 150 in 2019 so far. Note that Windermere apply for their certificates later in the year for autumn/winter racing.

Newsletters and Seahorse issues replacing Yearbook

The Rating Office continues to issue regular newsletters to our GBR owners with news and information regarding IRC.

During 2018 it was decided not to produce a printed IRC Yearbook in 2019. To replace the yearbook there are exclusive free IRC editions of Seahorse Magazine available to IRC members. This includes IRC specific news and information similar to the content covered in the IRC yearbook.

Weighing and Measuring

We have had a very busy year with IRC weighing and measurement in the UK. The Rating Office invested in two new weighing scales at substantial cost. These are 7.5 tonnes and 12 tonnes and include a wireless digital link for better accuracy and ease of use.

The winter weighing and discount scheme was discontinued in 2018 as the incentive did not produce the uptake as expected. Conversely that time of year was busier than expected at the end of 2018.

IRC Application Process and MyIRC

This year has seen successful continued use of the MyIRC online application portal. A service to owners includes upload of their IRC certificates (including trials) to their MyIRC account so they can login and download a copy at any time. We are looking at a further update to our systems that may include additional functionality for IRC certificate owners.

The MyIRC system continues to look at options for use by Rule Authorities in other countries.

Rating Office Staff

We are pleased to welcome Sally Moss to our small team. Sally joined us at the end of February 2019 and works with the Technical Team on IRC certificates as well as some general administration. With a background in customer service and hostessing with flotilla sailing holidays, and a trained dinghy instructor, Sally knows her way around a boat and also sails with her husband Simon and dog Alfie.
